Part 4 of 5: The Shoebox

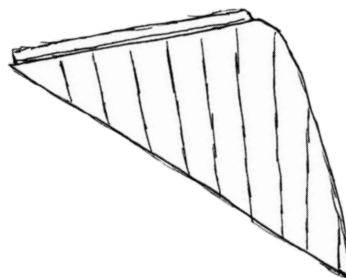
Malina and Cooper stared up in awe at the ancient trees.




